

# Green Mobility

Combating climate change and supporting the ecological transition is one of the main priorities of the Erasmus+ 2021-2027 program.

This priority is part of the Green Pact for Europe, a European strategy spearheaded by Commission President Ursula Von der Leyen, which aims to achieve carbon neutrality by 2050 in the fight against climate change.

The Erasmus+ 2021-2027 program will strive to limit its own impact on the environment, not only by promoting sustainable modes of transport and more responsible behavior, but also by equipping citizens with the skills and competencies to contribute to environmental sustainability.

To reward everyone's action in supporting the ecological transition, the European Commission has introduced a **financial supplement** for anyone receiving an Erasmus grant who uses eco-responsible transport (**bus, car-sharing, train, car, bike, etc.**).
