

Disability



Erasmus + (2021/2027) aims to promote equity and inclusion by facilitating access for participants from disadvantaged backgrounds and with fewer opportunities than their peers, where the situation of these people limits or their participation in transnational activities". Inclusion is a key priority for the program. The aim is to develop projects that promote equal opportunities for people with fewer opportunities due to their social, economic or cultural background, their social, economic or cultural background, their disability, their origin (landlocked or outermost regions).

Among the factors limiting the mobility of these people, socio-economic, but also disability or health problems:

- disability (i.e. participants with special needs): people with mental disabilities (intellectual, cognitive or learning disabilities), physical, sensory or other disability
- health problems: people suffering from chronic health problems or psychiatric pathologies

A flat-rate "support for inclusion" financial supplement is awarded to encourage the participation of people meeting this condition. In order to benefit from this, proof of eligibility is required: MDPH decision certificate or certificate of long-term illness or disability card, etc.

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This point is of particular interest to potential beneficiaries of the beneficiaries of the Erasmus + program, since the program provides additional costs directly related to disabled participants and their participants and their carers.

The program also provides additional funding to enable participants to have access to adapted technical and pedagogical technical and pedagogical support based on real-life experience. All costs directly related to the disability of the participant and any accompanying the program, including the travel and living expenses of any travel and living expenses.

Funding based on actual costs for the care of the persons concerned, and additional and additional organizational funding of €100/participant concerned.

Funding on the basis of actual costs will be provided for the expenses necessary for mobility. Priority will be given to applications situations related to disability or long-term illness (ALD).
