

Inclusion

The Erasmus+ program for the period 2021-2027 has set 4 priorities: - Inclusion and diversity - The environment and combating climate change - Digital transformation - Active participation in democratic life and citizenship.

Inclusion and diversity are key priorities for the program. It is about developing projects that promote equal opportunities for people with fewer opportunities due to their social, economic or cultural backgrounds, their disability and their location (landlocked or outermost regions).

As part of a national policy of inclusion, 5 criteria specified in the Erasmus+ circular identify specific target groups for which the Erasmus+ France Agency triggers a "support for inclusion" financial supplement.

Here are the **5 eligible criteria** for the INCLUSION financial supplement on Erasmus scholarship:

Criteria	Supporting documents
1. In a situation of disability or long-term illness (ALD)	MDPH decision certificate or certificate of long-term or disability card, etc.
2. Living in a commune classified as a Zone de Revitalisation Rurale/ revitalization zone (ZRR)	Proof of address (energy bill, water bill, home insurance, etc.). If the participant's name does not appear on the proof of address certificate, this must be completed with the name of the host or an administrative document from the sending establishment, etc.

3. Living at an address classified as a Quartiers Prioritaires de la Ville	Proof of address (energy bill, water bill, home insurance, etc.). If the participant's name does not appear on the proof of address certificate, this must be completed with the name of the host or an administrative document from the sending establishment, etc.
4. Higher education grant holder on social criteria 6 and 7 (CROUS)	Notification of national scholarship
5. From a household with a CAF family quota is less than or equal to €566	CAF family allowance certificate

For information, this grant is in addition to the Erasmus long-term grant (long-term internships/academic exchanges) or for the Erasmus short-term grant (short-term internships/participation in an academic exchange).

In practical terms, INCLUSION means an additional €250 on the monthly Erasmus+ grant. It applies automatically to students who meet one of the 5 criteria above. (For short higher education mobility, the additional amount is 150 euros for an activity lasting from 15 to 30 days and 100 euros for a mobility of 5 to 14 days).
